### Cub League - Joe's Legacy

Last month Joe Bilskie Sr. passed away, but his legacy lives on - the Cub League Park - for which he worked hard so many years. Mrs.

Bilskie was quoted in the paper: "He was the guy who got it going and kept it going through the years." Joe was inducted into the Babe Ruth Hall of Fame in 1988. Just shortly before his death, he was awarded the Bronze Star for his 37 months of infantry service in World War II. His years of dedication to local baseball were recognized by the naming of the Joe Bilskie Field, in his honor.

The Joe Bilskie Cub League Park is a fantastic facility for Vincennes to have. It literally draws thousands of people each spring and summer.

This year, again, it will host the 10 year old's Cal Ripken World Series. Ten teams from eight regional sites across the country will compete.

It will be held August 7 to August 14. It will also host the Ohio Valley Regional for 12 year old's from July 23 to July 30th. Kirk Bouchie and Matt Minderman, along with all their volunteers, have done a great job upgrading the facility each year and are helping to keep Joe's Legacy alive.


The Niehaus grandchildren are also making good use of Joe's field. We have 3 boys and 5 girls playing baseball and softball there this season. This keeps Papa and Nana busy attending games.

The Niehaus's also have a connection with the Joe Bilskie family. By 1969, we had outgrown our Main Street location for the lumber business, so we looked all over the county for a location next to a railroad. Joe Bilskie sold us 7 acres next to the CSX Railroad on Elkhorn Road and that was the start of WBM. We later bought an additional 38 acres from the Sievers family, which now gives us 45 acres - plenty of room to grow.

### Guidelines for Displaying the Flag

1. The flag of the United States should be flown daily from sunrise to sunset in good weather from public buildings, schools, permanent staffs, and in or near polling places on election days. The flag may be displayed 24 hours a day on patriotic holidays or if properly illuminated.
  2. The flag should not be displayed on days when the weather is bad, except when an all-weather flag is used.
  3. The flag should always be flown on national and state holidays and on those occasions proclaimed by the President. On Memorial Day, the flag should be half staffed until noon.
  4. The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously. It should never be dipped to any person nor should it ever be displayed with the union down, except as a signal of dire distress.
- 
5. The flag should never touch anything beneath it, nor should it ever be carried flat or holding anything.
  6. It should never be used as wearing apparel, bedding, drapery, or decoration, nor for carrying or holding anything.
  7. The flag should never be fastened, displayed, used, or stored in such a manner as to be easily torn, soiled, or damaged. It should never be used as a covering for a ceiling.
  8. The flag should not be draped over the hood, top, sides, or back of a vehicle. When a flag is displayed on a car, the flag's staff should be fixed firmly to the chassis or clamped to the right fender.
  9. The flag or its staff should never be used for advertising purposes in any manner whatsoever. Nor should any picture, drawing, insignia or other decoration be placed on or attached to the flag, its staff, or halyard.
  10. The flag should not be embroidered on cushions, handkerchiefs, or other personal items nor printed on anything designed for temporary use and discarded. However, a flag patch may be affixed to the uniform of military personnel, firemen and policemen.
  11. When the flag is worn or soiled that it is no longer suitable for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning.

## How to protect yourself from identity theft

"Identity theft" sounds like a movie title, but it is a real-life horror story for hundreds of thousands of people every year.

Identity theft occurs when someone fraudulently uses your personal information - your social security number, driver's license number, birth date, etc. - to apply for credit, services, or benefits using your name. Lawsuits, garnished wages, and tax liens can result. To make matters worse, because the theft is "invisible," you may not discover it quickly. How can you protect yourself? Here are some practical steps you can take.

- **Watch the numbers.** Store your social security card in a safe place.

Don't print your social security number on your checks, and refrain from using it as a password on your financial or Internet accounts. If you are required to provide your social security number, find out how it will be used and how it will be protected.



- **Keep your data confidential.** Give out your birth date only when absolutely necessary. Leave off either the day or the year, if possible. Prevent your account numbers from falling into the wrong hands by shredding documents rather than simply discarding them. Shred all discarded mail that contains personal information, such as pre-approved credit offers.

- **Monitor your credit.** Check your monthly bills to make sure all charges are legitimate. Investigate unusual items immediately.

Consider lowering the limit on your credit cards to reduce the extent of fraudulent activity if a card is stolen or lost. Cancel cards you no longer use.

Order a credit report at least annually. Check it for errors and notify the credit bureau if you find any.

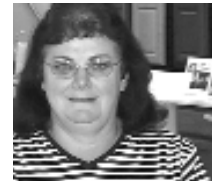

It's even hotter than usual in Phoenix, 116 degrees sets a new record, the Associated Press reports:

About 2,000 inmates living in a barbed-wire-surrounded tent encampment at Maricopa County Jail have been given permission to strip down to their government-issued pink boxer shorts.



On Wednesday, hundreds of men wearing boxers were either curled up on their bunk beds or chatted in tents, which reached 138 degrees inside the week before. Many were also swathed in wet, pink towels as sweat collected on their chests and dripped down to their pink socks.

"It feels like we are in a furnace," said James Zanzo't, an inmate who has lived in the tent for 1-1/2 years. "It's inhumane."

Joe Arpaio, the tough-guy sheriff who created the tent city and long ago started making his prisoners wear pink, and eat bologna sandwiches, is not one bit sympathetic..

He said Wednesday that he told all of the inmates: "It's 120 degrees in Iraq and our soldiers are living in tents too, and they didn't commit any crimes, so shut your d--- mouths."
