My Aunt "Byo"

Viola Fuller died last week at the age of 94. She was my aunt and I gave her the name of "Byo" when I was a little boy and couldn't say Viola. Ever since that time she has been known to my family and my nineteen grandchildren as "Aunt Byo." As a little boy, I used to go to her house and play. She lived right

across the street from the old firehouse on Second Street (where Vincennes University Davis Hall now sits). I loved to watch the fire trucks come and go.

Byo was preceded in death by her two sisters, Ella Mae Hunter, Naomi Niehaus (my mother) and a brother, James Oakes. Their mother died when Byo was only eleven years old. In his eulogy at the funeral, her son B.D. told us that their mother had gathered them all together before her death and ask Byo to take care of her siblings. They have all died now - my mother being the last - so now Byo's job was done. She is survived by her son B.D. Fuller and his wife Karen and her two grandchildren, Brook and his wife, Holly Fuller, and Brittney and her husband Brian Kirwer.

Byo and my mother both worked at the Brown Show Factory during the Depression for .25 an hour. They said they did the fancy stitching on the shoes. Her husband, Bert Fuller died in 1967. After his death, she came to work at our Niehaus Home Center. She was one of the first females on our sales floor. Byo was an energetic and friendly person who all the customers liked. She later managed our Paint Department and was a valuable asset to the company.

While B.D. was growing up, Byo took a very active role in his childhood, as he related in his eulogy. She was a PTA President, a Room Mother, a Den Mother and a partner in his many practical jokes. Byo spent many hours at the kitchen table sticking sticks in hot dogs (over a million, I think) for B.D.'s Pronto Pup stand - she was a good mother.

Byo was also a very Christian woman, joining the First Christian D disciple of Christ Church in 1940. She was active in the church serving as a Sunday School Teacher for over 20 years. B.D. found over seven-teen perfect attendance medals in her cedar chest. Byo will be missed by many and like my mother she was a GREAT LADY.

(CBS News)

A campaign to use cell phones in the treatment or identification of accident and disaster victims has taken off worldwide since the first bomb attacks in London earlier this month.

Mobile phone users are being urged to enter a number in their phone's memory with the acronym ICE, for In Case Of emergency, with the contact person's name and number.

Paramedics or police would be able to swiftly find the number and use it to reach a relative or friend who could help identify deceased victims and treat injured ones, by providing vital personal information, including details of any medical conditions.

ICE is not foolproof - when somebody locks the phone out, or if the phone is broken in an incident or accident obviously it would not work. It does have potential to save lives, however, individuals should still carry some contact/identification with them.

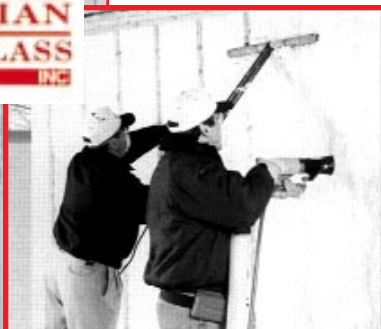

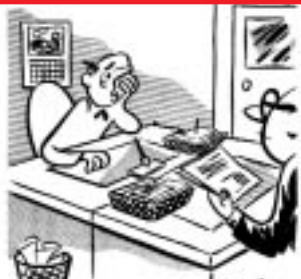

Innocent Spouse Relief

While filing a joint tax return offers married taxpayers a number of benefits, it can also result in one spouse being penalized for the other's erroneous reporting. When taxpayers file a joint report, both taxpayers are jointly and individually responsible for the tax and interest or penalties due on their joint return. The IRS can hold either spouse responsible for paying applicable taxes and penalties, regardless of who earned the income or whether a divorce decree states that one spouse will be held responsible.

The IRS does, however, offer relief from the tax, interest, and penalties due on a joint tax return - innocent spouse relief. You may request innocent spouse relief if your spouse improperly reported items or omitted items on your joint tax return. In order to qualify for innocent spouse relief, you must meet the following conditions:

- The understatement of tax on your return must be due to erroneous items reported by your spouse. Erroneous items, as defined by the IRS include unreported income, and incorrect deductions or credits.
- You must prove that you did not know about the understatement of tax at the time that you signed the return; further, you must establish that you had no way of knowing about the errors. In considering if you had a reason to know about the errors, the IRS will look at the nature of the erroneous item, you and your spouse's financial situation, your educational background, the extent of your participation in the activity that resulted in the error, and whether you failed to question items on the return that a reasonable person would question.
- Your situation is such that, when all circumstances are considered, it would be unfair to hold you liable. Circumstances considered include whether you received a significant benefit from the understatement, whether your spouse deserted you, and whether you were divorced or separated when the error occurred.
- You and your spouse must not have transferred property to each other in an attempt to defraud the IRS or any other individual.

To apply for innocent spouse relief, you must file Form 8857, Request for Innocent Spouse Relief within two years of the date the IRS began collection attempts, and you must attach a separate statement explaining why you qualify for relief.
